CORE ACTIVITIES for Green Events

- Recycling. Events must provide recycling for its participants. Recycling should be highly visible and made available to the public with clear signage. The organizers of this event pledge that they provide recycling for:
- Glass bottles, aluminum cans, plastic bottles, paper, cardboard
- Chesapeake Recycle Days allows the public to recycle all of the following: In general, accepted items will include electronics, clothing, household items, household hazardous waste, paper & sensitive documents, plastic bags as well as general recyclables.

- Minimize the use of disposable food service products. The facility is required to minimize the use of disposable food service products and maximize the use of food service products that are recyclable or compostable in the food service area. When disposable food service items are used, the facility is encouraged to use products that are made from biobased or renewable resources, and to provide for the collection / recycling / composting of food service items disposed of on the premises. This facility pledges that they:
- Use disposable foodservice items that are recyclable (in your area!)
- **Waste Reduction.** Event planners should make a general commitment to reduce the amount of waste generated by their event. The organizers of this event pledge that they:
 - Track overall solid waste costs

Logistics

- Encourage the use of mass-transit and/or carpooling to the event Provide for recycling of boxes and other set-up wastes
- **Green Signage.** Event planners must commit to tell their participants about how green the event is. Event signage should include the Virginia Green logo and list all "green activities" practiced in the planning and operation of the event. The organizers of this event pledge that they:
 - Have a link on its website to the Virginia Green Events webpage
 - Have signs at the event registration which list all of its green activities
 - Use the Virginia Green logo on signs and on recycling containers
- **Other Sustainability Actions.** Such as purchase locally produced products and supplies, purchase organic or sustainably grown food, protect/enhance wildlife habitat on property, educate customers about efforts to reduce our environmental impacts, etc.)
 - Chesapeake Parks, Recreation and Tourism Special Events is making a big effort to education our citizens about our efforts to reduce our environmental impacts.
