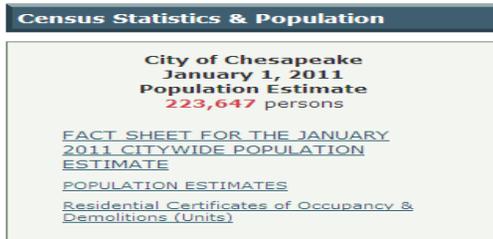

Getting Started

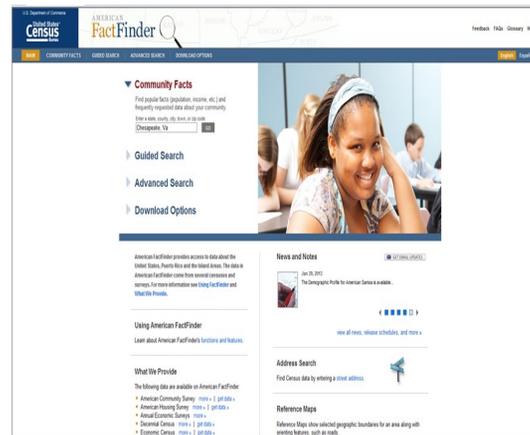
From here you can access the City's annual *Statistical Profile* which is updated each summer, the *US Census Bureau*, the *American FactFinder*, and various other fact sheets with population estimates and other useful bits of information.

Census Tracts: in the *Statistical Profile*, much of the data is organized by Census Tracts, geographic divisions across Chesapeake that serve as the units from which census data is collected. The city contains 41 Census Tracts. To identify which tract your organization operates within, reference the Census Tract Map. One is located in *Section 1* of the *Statistical Profile*. The map is also available in the Planning Department's online *Map Gallery*, which can be accessed at the bottom of the left-hand navigation menu of the department's home webpage.

U.S. Census Bureau

A great resource with a wealth of data is the **U.S. Census Bureau's (www.census.gov) American Community Survey (ACS)**.

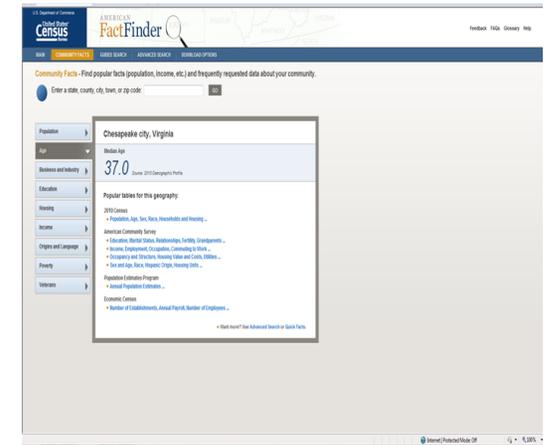
- From the Planning Department's *Census & Demographics* webpage select “American Fact Finder” on the right-hand side.
