Service Categories

- *Children receiving Special Education services, placed in private day or residential as written in their IEP.
- *Special Education students eligible for wraparound services.
- *Children in the custody of the local department of social services.
- *Children at risk of entering foster care (prevention).
- *Children involved in the court system and on probation.
- *Children In Need of Services (CHINS)

Emergency Services

*Emergent = issue is life threatening and requires immediate attention

FAPT ≠ Emergent Services or Care

FAPT has a multi-level approval process. Should there be emergent needs, the referral agency's Emergency Response Plan should be used until the next FAPT meeting, where supportive, wraparound or other appropriate services can be explored.

Children's Services Act for At-Risk Youth and their Families

*The Children's Services Act (CSA) is a state law that establishes a single state pool of funds to purchase services for at-risk youth and their families.

*It is the mission of the CSA to create a collaborative system of services and funding that is child-centered, family-focused, and community-based when addressing the strengths and needs of troubled and at-risk youths and their families in the commonwealth.

*Each locality oversees administration of the Act through their Interagency Consortium.

*In Chesapeake the CSA is administered and operated by the Chesapeake Interagency Consortium (CIC).



*The Family Assessment & Planning Team (FAPT) is a group of professionals and parents that work collaboratively to help children through use of the FAPT process. Members generally include referral/core agencies, private providers and parents.

*The primary focus of FAPT is to assess the strengths and needs of a youth and their family and then work with that family to best meet their needs.

*The FAPT seeks to help guardians help their children by providing them the tools they need to better understand their child's needs and manage their behavior.

Chesapeake CSA Seeks to:

*Ensure youth are in the least restrictive environment while preserving families, protecting children's welfare, and maintaining public safety.

*Identify early interventions to prevent the need for more restrictive services.

*Implement services that are responsive to diverse strengths and needs.

*Build upon public/private partnerships.
