Drivers can also save money on tolls with the Chesapeake Expressway Discount Program. Discount program members only pay a .75 cent toll rate for a two-axle vehicle. ### DOMINION BOULEVARD PROJECT

- During the month of February, steady work continued on the Dominion Boulevard Improvement project. A work zone speed limit was set up at 35mph. The Blake Street/Byron Street pedestrian tunnel was closed and will remain closed through the summer of 2014. Pine Wood Run was closed at the Dominion Boulevard intersection and will be turned into a cul-de-sac. Clearing, surveying, erosion, and sediment control took place at various locations throughout the project area. Test piles were driven for the bridges over the Elizabeth River. ### A NEW 7-11 IN CHESAPEAKE

- The Development and Permits Department issued a building permit for Mid Atlantic Petroleum Services. The Chesapeake-based contractor, secured a building permit to construct a new 7-11 store equipped with covered gas pumps at 1498 South Military Highway. The permit construction value for the store and canopy is listed at \$476,797.

### HALL CHEVROLET RENOVATION

- The City of Chesapeake Development and Permits Department issued a renovation permit involving 61,402 square feet to the Hall Chevrolet, located at 3412 Western Branch Boulevard. The building will be refurbished inside and out and will cost around \$1,115,181. The Virginia Beach-based McKenzie Construction Corporation will handle the project.

### FLOOD ZONE MANAGEMENT ORDINANCE

- Between February 25 and March 15, the Planning Department will be seeking feedback on proposed enhancements to the City's Flood Zone Management Ordinance that could reduce flood insurance rates. Citizens can complete an on-line survey during this time or attend a meeting on March 4, from 6:00 p.m. - 7:30 p.m. in the Multi-Purpose Room, School Administration Building, 312 Cedar Road.
