PROJECT UPDATE AND TOLL SCHEDULE

The Transportation Toll Facility Advisory Committee provides recommendations to the City Council regarding proposals for new tolls in the City. The Committee will seek input from the public and from the owner and operator of the transportation facility regarding the new toll.

The purpose of this public hearing is to review the proposed toll schedule for the new South Norfolk Jordan Bridge. A two-dollar passenger vehicle rate has been announced and a full toll schedule, including truck rates, will be available at the meeting. The public hearing will start with an open house information session from 5:30 to 6:30 with a formal hearing directly following. Staff from Figg Bridge Builders and the South Norfolk Jordan Bridge, members of Chesapeake's Transportation Toll Facility Advisory Committee and representatives from the Chesapeake Public Works Department will be on hand to receive comments and answer questions.

The meeting provides an opportunity for any individual, association, citizens' group or governmental agency to offer comments for the project record. Citizens may submit comments on the proposed toll schedule and other information regarding the project at the meeting or by email, phone or U.S. Postal Service to the Chesapeake Department of Public Works by June 11. The Transportation Toll Facility Advisory Committee will issue an advisory report to the City Council shortly after the close of the comment period. Because the bridge will be privately owned and operated, the final decision on the toll schedule will be made by the South Norfolk Jordan Bridge.
